

3 types of alerts:

Non-Severe, Severe, and Imminent





<u>Non-Severe</u>

(less urgent)

These alerts are regarding unhealthy activities by students. They may not need immediate attention but are behaviors that should/could be addressed with students.

i.e. sexting, un-shared pornography & sexual content/language etc.

Triaged

or

Documentation only, school not notified.

Email admin. team and/or counseling team

Because the alert is **not** urgent, email response by the

esponse by the school is **not** reauired. 2

<u>Severe</u>

(semi-urgent)

These alerts are regarding harm to self or others and may need some immediate attention, many students just need a check in.

i.e. suicidal thoughts and ideation, use of drugs/alcohol, indications of bullying or violence.

Triaged

Documentation only, school not notified.

Email admin.
team and/or
counseling
team

A read receipt will be attached to the email, or the school can reply back indicating the notice was received.

<u>Imminent</u>

(urgent)

These alerts are more time sensitive and detailed regarding harm to self or others. They need immediate attention.

i.e. suicide note or plan, plan of violence, threats, drug use that may need immediate or legal attention.

Triaged



During School Hours: Call or text admin. team NOT During School Hours: Call parent listed in Skyward, or police/crisis dispatch then also later notify

admin
